1st priority for new J&K govt would be uniting people of Jammu, Kashmir: Farooq Abdullah

Srinagar: National Conference (NC) president Farooq Abdullah on Saturday said the first priority for the new government in Jammu and Kashmir would be to unite the people of the two regions of the Union Territory and get rid of the "hatred" that was "pushed" in the recently-held Assembly polls.

He also said restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood would be on the new government's agenda.

"Our first priority will be to unite Jammu and Kashmir and remove the hatred that was pushed in this election," Abdullah told reporters after participating in the Dussehra celebrations here.

The NC-Congress alliance has staked claim to form the government in Jammu and Kashmir after securing a clear majority in the polls. The Communist Party of India (Marxist), the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and several Independent legislators have extended support to the coalition.

Chief minister-designate Omar Abdullah met Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Friday and requested him to fix the date for the swearing-in ceremony at the earliest.

Asked if restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood would also be a priority for the new



government, the NC chief said it is already on the agenda.

"We are already requesting that statehood must be restored so that the state can work and we can get on with our job," he added.

The BJP-led Centre abrogated the provisions of Article 370 of the Constitution, which had given special rights to Jammu and Kashmir, in August 2019 and bifurcated the erstwhile state into Union territories.

Abdullah said Dussehra celebrates the victory of truth over falsehood.

"The biggest message from this is that lies get defeated and the truth wins. You yourself saw how lies were burning and truth was rising. This was their lesson and Lord Ram had also said the

same," the former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister said.

The veteran leader said this was the first time that the organisers of the Dussehra event invited him

"I was a member of Parliament for the last five years but they did not remember me. But today, when they remembered me, I came and it felt very good. I used to watch this in my father's time. Our Hindu brothers also used to participate in it. We miss them a lot and I pray to god that the void is filled next year," he said.

The former chief minister batted for the return of Kashmiri Pandits to the valley

Pandits to the valley.
"I hope our brothers and sisters who left Kashmir return and take care of their homes. The

time has come for their return and they should return sooner," he said

Asked if the new regime in the Union Territory would take any step for their return, Abdullah said there would be a government initiative as the NC not only thinks about Kashmiri Pandits, but also about the people of Jammu.

"We have to treat them (the people of Jammu) well, so that they also feel that the NC government is not their enemy. We want to take everyone together," he added.

Abdullah said his party's government will empower everyone, whether they are Dogras, Punjabis or Kashmiris, and there will be no discrimination against any resident of Jammu and Kashmir. Asked if the leaders of the INDIA bloc will be invited for the oath-taking ceremony, the former Union minister answered in the affirmative.

"We have already invited everyone, they just have to be told about the date," he added. Replying to a question on Baramulla MP Sheikh Abdul Rashid alias Engineer Rashid's meeting with the LG regarding the release of political prisoners, Abdullah said, "He should get himself released first, then talk about political prisoners." (PTI)

Half-brother Noel to succeed Ratan Tata as chairman of Tata Trusts

Mumbai: Noel Tata, the half-brother of late Ratan Tata, will be the next chairman of Tata Trusts, sources said on Friday.

The 67-year-old Noel was chosen by the board to lead the string of philanthropic trusts that control the Tata empire.

Having functioned mostly under the shadows of his illustrious half-brother, Noel will now have the responsibility of leading the Tata Trusts -- broadly comprising Sir Ratan Tata Trust & Allied Trusts, and Sir Dorabji Tata Trust & Allied Trusts -- that hold a controlling 66 per cent stake in Tata Sons, the holding and promoter firm of Tata Group companies.

He is already a trustee on the boards of Sir Ratan Tata Trust and Sir Dorabji Tata Trust.

Known to keep a low profile, Noel has been a trustee on the important trusts, and was also seen at the cremation of his half brother on Thursday.

The meeting of the Tata Trusts board was held to choose the successor to Ratan Tata after his demise on Wednesday. A formal announcement of the successor is expected later in the day.

Noel has been involved with the Tata Group since 1999, and chairs the successful retail arm Trent, which looks after chains like Westside and Zudio and c o m m a n d s a m a r k e t capitalisation of over Rs 2 lakh crore. He is also the chairman of



Voltas and Tata International.

Noel is married to Aloo Mistry, the sister of the late Cyrus Mistry and a part of the Shapoorji Pallonji family, which is the single largest private shareholder of Tata Sons with more than 18.4 per cent holding.

Relations between the Shapoorji Pallonji group and the Tatas have not been warm since the sacking of Cyrus Mistry from the chairmanship of Tata Sons.

Tata Sons operates all commercial enterprises in the group and collectively reported revenues of USD 165 billion last year.

Noel was seen as a front runner to succeed Ratan Tata at Tata Trusts, and there was also speculation about Ratan Tata's long-time confidante Mehli Mistry.

According to some reports, Mehli, who is already a trustee on the Tata Trusts, is being considered to be made as a permanent trustee. However, there was no confirmation of the same. (PTI)

Ratan Tata: The Humble Titan Who Transformed Indian Industry and Touched Millions with His Legacy

Ratan Naval Tata, a name synonymous with decency, integrity, and corporate excellence, passed away at the age of 86 in a Mumbai hospital on a Wednesday night. Tata, though one of the most influential industrialists globally, never appeared on any list of billionaires. Instead, he led a life marked by humility and unpretentiousness, controlling over 30 companies operating across six continents. His legacy, however, is not only defined by his immense business success but also by his philanthropy and dedication to societal betterment. Born in 1937, Tata was educated at Cornell University, where he earned a degree in architecture. Despite having the opportunity to work abroad, he returned to India in 1962 to join the family business, the Tata Group, His early career was spent on the shop floor of Tata Steel in Jamshedpur, where he worked alongside laborers, learning the ins and outs of the business from the ground up. This hands-on experience shaped his understanding of business and his leadership style, which was always rooted in humility and a willingness to learn.

In 1991, Tata succeeded his uncle, J.R.D. Tata, as chairman of the Tata Group. This was a pivotal time for India, as the country was opening its economy to the world. Under Tata's visionary leadership, the group underwent a transformation, growing into a global powerhouse with interests spanning industries such as steel, automobiles, software, and consumer goods. His strategic acquisitions, including those of Tetley Tea, Daewoo Motors, Corus Group, and the iconic Jaguar and Land Rover brands, firmly positioned Tata Group on the global stage.

Tata's contributions, however, extended far beyond business. His deep sense of responsibility and commitment to societal welfare were evident in his leadership of the Tata Trusts, one of India's oldest and most influential philanthropic organizations. Under his guidance, the Trusts made significant contributions to healthcare, education, and rural development. Tata personally oversaw the establishment of institutions such as the Tata Institute of Social Sciences and supported numerous educational projects across the country. His belief that businesses have a duty



to give back to society was a guiding principle throughout his career.

One of Tata's most notable projects was the launch of the Tata Nano in 2009. The car, billed as the world's most affordable, was aimed at making car ownership accessible to Indian families. Despite facing challenges in production and marketing, the Nano remained a symbol of Tata's commitment to innovation and social progress. His vision extended beyond just selling cars; it was about empowering the common man and addressing the unique challenges faced by Indian consumers.

Ratan Tata's humility and modest lifestyle were key aspects of his persona. He eschewed the trappings of wealth and luxury, living a simple life despite his vast business empire. Tata was an aviation enthusiast, becoming the first Indian to fly an F-16 fighter jet in 2007. He also had a deep love for animals, especially dogs, and even created a kennel at Bombay House, the Tata Group's headquarters, for stray dogs. His love for animals and his connection to nature further highlighted his compassionate nature, both as a businessman and as a person.

One of the most defining moments in Tata's life was his response to the 26/11 Mumbai attacks. When the Taj Mahal Palace Hotel, a Tata-owned property, was targeted, Tata personally visited victims and their families, ensuring they were taken care of. His dedication to rebuilding the hotel and supporting the affected employees underscored his deep commitment to both his business and the people who worked for him.

Though controversies touched his career, including the leaked Radia tapes in the 2008 telecom scam, Tata was never implicated in any wrongdoing. His integrity remained intact throughout his life, and he was widely respected for his ethical approach to

business. Even after retiring as chairman of Tata Sons in 2012, Tata continued to play an active role in business and society. He mentored young entrepreneurs and invested in over 30 techdriven startups, including Ola Electric, Paytm, and Lenskart, helping to shape the future of Indian business.

Tata's personal life was as modest as his business legacy. Despite coming close to marriage several times, he never married, citing personal and family obligations that prevented him from pursuing relationships. His humility and grounded nature were reflected in his daily interactions, whether with industry leaders or common citizens. He believed in treating everyone with respect, a principle that endeared him to

Through his leadership and philanthropy, Ratan Tata left an indelible mark on Indian society. His contributions to education, healthcare, and rural development improved countless lives, and his emphasis on ethical entrepreneurship set a high standard for corporate governance in India. His leadership during key acquisitions, such as Jaguar Land Rover, positioned Tata Group as

a global leader in multiple industries, while his post-retirement focus on mentoring startups demonstrated his forward-thinking approach to business.

Tata's life and legacy are a testament to the power of responsible leadership. He transformed the Tata Group into a global conglomerate while maintaining the values of integrity, humility, and social responsibility. His philanthropic initiatives, particularly through Tata Trusts, continue to have a lasting impact on education, healthcare, and rural development in India. Even after stepping down from active leadership, his influence remains visible in the success of the companies he mentored and the lives he touched.

In a world where business success is often equated with wealth and power, Ratan Tata stood apart as a leader who valued humility, service, and the greater good. His life serves as an inspiration to future generations, not just as a business titan, but as a man who truly understood the meaning of leadership and responsibility. His legacy will continue to inspire and guide the corporate and philanthropic worlds for years to come.

Karachi Airport explosion linked to foreign intelligence agency: preliminary report

Karachi: A preliminary report over the recent explosion near Pakistan's busiest airport here has indicated that the attack was executed with the assistance of a foreign intelligence agency, a media report said on Saturday.

The report, submitted by the C o u n t e r - T e r r o r i s m Department (CTD) to the anti-terrorism court, stated that the suicide bombing targeted Chinese engineers as part of a conspiracy to damage Pakistan-China relations, The Express Tribune reported.

On Sunday, two Chinese nationals were killed and 17 people injured in the suicide attack by a Baloch insurgent group that targeted a convoy of Chinese workers.

The explosion near the Jinnah International Airport on Sunday night also killed the suspected suicide bomber.

The preliminary report identified the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) as being involved in the attack and indicated that the attack was executed with the assistance of a foreign intelligence agency, the Tribune said.

It suggested that an unidentified terrorist parked their vehicle close to a convoy of Chinese nationals before detonating the explosive, the report said.

Upon hearing the blast, police arrived at the scene and found injured individuals, including personnel from police and Rangers.

The Chinese nationals were working at the Port Qasim Electric Power Company on the outskirts of the city and were returning home when their convoy was attacked.

A case has been registered at the Airport police station under the supervision of the station house officer.

The CTD's report includes charges of murder, attempted murder, assault, use of explosive materials, and terrorism, among other counts

Earlier this week, an initial investigation report confirmed the tragic event

involved 70 to 80 kg of explosives.

On Friday, China said it has dispatched an inter-agency working group to Pakistan following the deadly suicide bomb attack in Karachi.

Thousands of Chinese personnel are working in Pakistan on several projects under the aegis of the USD 60 billion China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

Balochistan, bordering Iran and Afghanistan, is home to a long-running violent in surgency. Baloch insurgent groups have previously carried out several attacks targeting CPEC projects.

The BLA accuses China and Islamabad of exploitation of the resource-rich province, a charge rejected by the authorities. It has fought a long-running insurgency for a separate homeland.

The group in the last two years carried out similar suicide bomb attacks in Karachi targeting foreign nationals. (PTI)

Ukraine's Zelenskyy meets Pope Francis as he continues his European tour to push his 'victory plan'

Vatican City: Pope Francis met Volodymyr Zelenskyy at the Vatican on Friday, the latest step on the Ukrainian president's European tour to win support for his proposed "victory plan" aimed at ending the war with Russia.

The pope and the Ukrainian leader held private talks for 35 minutes. After their private meeting at the Sala della Biblioteca and the presentation of the Ukrainian delegation, Francis gave Zelenskyy a bronze plaque depicting a flower and an inscription reading: "Peace is a fragile flower."

In turn, Zelenskyy gifted the pontiff with an oil painting portraying "The massacre of Bucha. The story of Marichka." Bucha, a suburb northwest of Kyiv, was occupied by Russian troops shortly after the full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 and witnessed some of Russia's worst atrocities against civilians.

Later Friday, Zelenskyy met the Vatican's secretary of state, Pietro Parolin, accompanied by Archbishop Paul Richard Gallagher, secretary for relations with states and international organizations.

"The discussions were dedicated to the state of the war and the humanitarian situation

in Ukraine, as well as the ways in which it could be brought to an end, leading to just and stable peace in the country," the Vatican said in a statement, adding that "some matters relating to the religious life of the country were also examined."

Since the first Russian attack on Kyiv, there have been multiple contacts between Francis and Zelenskyy, through visits, letters and phone calls.

The pope sparked some criticism from Ukrainian leaders in March when he suggested they should have the courage of the "white flag" negotiating an end to the war with Russia, in what was intepreted by many as a call to surrender.

Francis has repeatedly and strongly for an end to the war, focusing on prisoner exchanges and on reaching a diplomatic solution to the Ukrainian conflict.

Cardinal Matteo Maria Zuppi was sent as a special envoy on a mission to ease tensions among the parties at war, meeting with political and ecclesiastical leaders around the world. His mission was, in particular, to encourage exchanges of Russian and Ukrainian prisoners and to find a way to facilitate the return of children forcibly deported from Ukraine to Russia.

Zelensky is city-hopping across Europe to promote a plan that he said "aims to create the right conditions for a just end to the war" against Russia, unveiling the proposals to European allies after a summit with President Joe Biden was derailed by Hurricane Milton.

On Thursday, Zelenskyy met with British Prime Minister Keir Starmer in London, French President Emmanuel Macron in Paris and Italian Premier Giorgia Meloni in Rome.

He is expected to travel to Germany later on Friday to hold talks with German Chancellor Olaf Scholz.

The Ukrainian leader has yet to publicly detail his proposals for "victory." But the timing of his efforts to lock in European support appear to have the looming US election in mind. Former President Donald Trump has long been critical of US aid to Kyiv.

Ukraine's stretched and shorthanded army is currently under heavy pressure in the country's eastern Donetsk region. Russian forces recently pushed it out of the Donetsk town of Vuhledar and are now in control of about half of nearby Toretsk, local administration chief Vasyl Chynchyk said Friday. To stop the losses, Zelenskyy needs to secure more help.(PTI)

Rupee falls 12 paise to hit all-time low of 84.10 against US dollar

Mumbai: The rupee on Friday fell 12 paise to a record low of 84.10 against the US dollar, tracking a weak trend in domestic equities and relentless foreign capital outflows.

The situation in the Middle East continues to be volatile and might keep oil prices high and the rupee weak in the short term, according to forex traders.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened slightly strong at 83.97 against the US dollar. During the session, the local currency oscillated between a high of 83.96 and a low of 84.10.

It finally settled at its all-time low of 84.10, a loss of 12 paise from its previous close. The domestic unit had closed

at 83.98 on Thursday.

"After keeping it in a range below 83.99 since August 8, 2024, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) finally allowed the rupee to weaken past 84 as FPIs who have emerged as big sellers in equities continued to buy USD to take their money out of the country," said Anil Kumar Bhansali, Head of Treasury and Executive Director, Finrex Treasury Advisors LLP

"We can now expect the rupee to move to 84.25 in the short term. Importers will continue buying at all dips, and exporters may now hold their exports with a stop below 8 3 . 9 5 . The elan/Israel/Lebanon news also does not seem good and could keep oil strong and the

rupee weak," he said.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was down 0.09 per cent to 102.89 points.

Brent crude, the international benchmark, slipped 0.57 per cent to USD 78.95 per barrel in futures trade.

In the domestic equity

market, the 30-share BSE Sensex was down 230.05 points to close at 81,381.36, while Nifty declined 34.20 points to settle at 24,964.25. For eign Institutional Investors (FIIs) were net sellers in the capital markets on Friday, as they offloaded shares worth Rs 4,162.66 crore, according to exchange data. (PTI)

India's forex kitty drops by USD 3.71 bln to USD 701.176 bln



Mumbai: India's forex reserves dropped by USD 3.709 billion to USD 701.176 billion for the week ended October 4, the RBI said on Friday.

In the previous reporting week, the reserves had jumped by USD 12.588 billion to an all-time high of USD 704.885 billion.

For the week ended October 4, foreign currency assets, a

major component of the reserves, decreased by USD 3.511 billion to USD 612.643 billion, the data released on Friday showed.

Expressed in terms of dollar, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.

Gold reserves decreased by

USD 40 million to USD 65.756 billion during the week, the RBI said.
The Special Drawing Rights

(SDRs) were down by USD 123 million to USD 18.425 billion, the apex bank said. India's reserve position with the IMF was down by USD 35 million to USD 4.352 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank data showed.(PTI)







Police Seize Large Quantity of Illegal Liquor in Salanpur Basti Raid

Katras: In a late-night raid on Tuesday, Katras police station and Ramkanali OP police jointly confiscated a significant quantity of foreign liquor and beer bottles from Salanpur Basti. Rajkumar Chauhan, the businessman was arrested and taken to Ramkanali OP for questioning. The police are now working to trace the larger network behind the illegal



liquor trade. According to OP in-charge Mangal Prasad Kujur, the raid

was conducted on the orders of senior officers. The authorities seized 12 boxes of foreign

liquor, beer, and cigarettes from Chauhan's residence. He admitted to running a small shop near his house where he sold foreign liquor, beer, and cigarettes.

A case has been registered against Rajkumar Chauhan, and further investigation is underway to uncover the bigger players involved in this illegal operation. The raid was led by Katras police station incharge Asit Kumar Singh and other officers.

BCCL Worker Drowns, Body Recovered After Hours Of Search

Dhanbad: In a tragic incident on Wednesday morning, 55-year-old Praveen Bhuiyan, a worker at BCCL's Sudamdih ASP Colliery, drowned while bathing in a pond near Hatalla Matal Baba Maidan under Sudamdih police station area. Praveen had returned home after completing his night shift and went to the pond for a bath. Despite efforts by local villagers, his body could not be found immediately.

Upon receiving the information, Sudamdih police reached the spot and began their investigation. Later in the afternoon, on the initiative of Jharia MLA Purnima Neeraj Singh, a professional diving team from Munidih was brought in to assist with the search. After several hours of effort, the diving team managed to recover Praveen's body from the pond, which reportedly contains a 40-foot deep pit.

The recovery of the body led to emotional scenes, with Praveen's family, including his wife Kusuma Devi, son Ashok Bhuiyan, and daughters Shobha Devi and Abha Devi, inconsolable at the site of the tragedy.

According to the family, the area has been facing severe water



shortages for the past 15-20 days, forcing residents to rely on the pond for daily activities like bathing and defecation. A protest had taken place at the BCCL office just a day earlier, but no action had been taken to resolve the issue.

The pond, once part of a mining operation by the NCDC company in 1974, remains hazardous with its deep waters. The diving team, comprising 100 individuals, was rewarded Rs.20,000 by MLA Purnima Neeraj Singh for their efforts. Local leaders, including Dr. Birendra Kumar Yadav, Abhishek Singh, and former councilor Sumit Supkar, were present at the scene during the rescue operation.

A uthorities are now investigating the incident and the broader issue of water scarcity in the area, which has left residents dependent on unsafe sources for their daily needs.

Decision on seat-sharing with allies after MCC announcement: Jharkhand Cong chief

Ranchi: Jharkhand Pradesh Congress Committee (JPCC) President Keshav Mahto Kamlesh on Saturday said a decision on seat-sharing among alliance partners would be taken after announcement of the Model Code of Conduct for the

ensuing assembly elections. Elections to the 81-member assembly in Jharkhand are due this year as the term of the present Vidhan Sabha comes to an end on January 5,2025.

"The decision on seatsharing among alliance partners will be made based on discussions after the announcement of the Model Code of Conduct here," Mahto told reporters.

He said all alliance partners stand united and are with the JMM-led coalition government

Mahto also said Congress leader Rahul Gandhi will come to Ranchi this

He, however, said that the date of Gandhi's visit is yet to be finalised. (PTI)

NABARD sanctions Rs 770 crore for two irrigation projects in Jharkhand

Ranchi: The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) on Saturday said it has sanctioned Rs 770 crore financial assistance for the construction of two irrigation projects in Jharkhand.

These projects were approved under the Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (RIDF) for the 2024-25 fiscal year.

"NABARD has sanctioned financial assistance of Rs 769.58 crore for construction of two irrigation projects in Palamu and Giridih districts under Rural Infrastructure Development Fund during FY 2024-25," S K Jahagirdar, Chief General Manager, NABARD



Jharkhand Regional Office,

Once completed, the project in Palamu will provide irrigation to an additional 11,000 hectares of land through pipelines across eight blocks in the district.

The megalift irrigation

project in Giridih will cover 165 of the 197 villages in Pirtand block, leading to the development of 10,158 hectares of cultivable command area.

Both projects are expected to significantly enhance agricultural activities in

these districts, according to NABARD.

The routine announcement by NABARD came as the state is gearing up for assembly elections, expected to be held this year.

The tenure of the current Jharkhand assembly of 81 members is due to expire on January 5, 2025.

"With this sanction, NABARD's support to Jharkhand under RIDF during FY 2024-25 has reached Rs 1,017 crore. The support provided to Jharkhand since the inception of the Rural Infrastructure Development Fund now stands at around Rs 24,300 crore," the bank said in a statement. (PTI)

Murder accused nabbed after 11 years from Jharkhand forest

New Delhi: A 50-year-old man was arrested from the forest area in Jharkhand for his alleged involvement in a case of murder committed in 2013 in Delhi's Tilak Nagar by six people over a property dispute.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime) SK Sain said it was a contract killing where six people, including Raju Banarasi alias Raju Singh alias Mritunjay Singh, was involved in the murder of Jitender Lamba.

The killers were paid Rs 10 lakh for the execution of murder by Jitender's real brother Rajesh Singh Lamba.

Five accused were arrested earlier, but Banarasi was on the run. The court had declared him a proclaimed offender and also announced a cash reward of Rs 50,000 on his arrest.

Sain said despite multiple setbacks and without any proper lead, the team relentlessly worked and after analyzing hundreds of mobile numbers of last ten years contact of arrested accused persons as well as their friends, finally a mobile phone of Banarasi's distant relative was found active in Jharkhand.

The number's location was constantly showing in the forest areas of Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand border.

"The team reached the location area and started work with the local labours to get access in the forest area smoothly as it is difficult to find the person in such dense forest," Sain said. During this, the team developed their sources and laid a tactful and strategic trap which finally succeed to zero down and nab Banarasi, who was driving a truck in the jungle area, he added.

Banarasi, who is unmarried, was staying in the jungle area with the help of a relative, police said. (PTI)



Balasore repeated as data-logger video shows train changed track before collision in TN: Experts

New Delhi: A day after a passenger train rammed into a stationary freight train near Chennai, experts and union leaders said according to the data-logger video, the Mysuru-Darbhanga Express train was given a green signal to pass through the main line, however, it entered a loop line already occupied by the freight train.

Train number 12578, Mysuru-Darbhanga Bagmati Express, collided with the stationary goods train at the Kavaraippettai railway station in the Chennai rail division in Tamil Nadu at around 8:30 pm on Friday, leading to injuries to nine passengers.

The data logger is a device placed in the station area to capture train movements and signal aspects, among other things.

This data logger's yardsimulation video has been circulated among senior railway officials' WhatsApp groups since Saturday morning, prompting them to draw a parallel between the accident and the Balasore train collision of June 2, 2023.

When contacted, the chief public relations officer (CPRO) of the Southern Railway said he is not aware of any such video and that multiple investigations have already been initiated into the collision.

In a press statement released late on Friday, the Railway Board also admitted that the passenger train was given a



green signal for the main line but it experienced a jerk and entered the loop line, resulting in the collision with the freight train. A high-level enquiry has been ordered into the incident.

The board said on Saturday that the commissioner of railway safety will conduct a detailed investigation as he visited the accident site in the morning.

In Balasore, the Howrah-bound Coromandel Express was given a green signal for the main line. However, due to the wrong interlocking of tracks, it entered a loop line and collided with a stationary goods train.

"Based on the information available in the public domain, it appears that this collision almost repeats the Balasore train collision of June 2, 2023. The railways should take a serious approach to remove the anomalies in the signalling system," R Kumaresan, president, All India Loco Running Staff Association (AILRSA), Southern Railway,

said.

According to safety experts, in an automatic-signalling system, the signal aspect follows the interlocking of tracks. It means if the signal is green for the main line, the interlocking will automatically be set in such a way that the train comes on the main line.

"The lack of coordination between signal aspect and interlocking happens due to some fault in the signalling system. Prime facie, it appears to be some kind of a technical glitch," a safety expert said, requesting anonymity.

Sanjay Pandhi, the working president of the Indian Railway Loco Runningmen's Organisation (IRLRO), expressed surprise as according to him, all previous trains passed through the said station "without any abnormalities in the signalling and interlocking system".

"In Balasore, the collision happened soon after the signalrepair work was over. Contrary to that, there was no such thing reported at the Kavaraippettai railway station and train operations were normal.

"So it appears that some malfunction, which could be corrosion of mechanical equipment etc., might have happened, leading to a coordination break of signal and interlocking," Pandhi said. K P Arya, who retired as the chief signal and telecom engineer/information technology in the Northern Railway, said, "The data logger's yard-simulation video shows that the train concerned is going on both the main line as well as the loop line, which is not possible."

"So there is a possibility that the train might have derailed at the interlocking point and while the engine and some coaches headed towards the loop line and collided with the freight train, the remaining coaches scattered all around, infringing the main line as well," he

Arya said it is a widely-known (but never officially acknowledged) engineering defect of tracks and interlocking-point mechanisms, which can cause such a derailment.

"I have gone on highlighting this aspect during my various tenures to the Railway Board as well as to the commissioner of railway safety," he said.

The experts said a clear picture would only emerge after a thorough investigation, which is already on.(PTI)

"What happened, we are analysing it, after that we will decide on what to do. We will have to face several elections in the days ahead, we will certainly look into it, keeping it (upcoming elections) in mind," he added.

The BJP won a third straight term in Haryana, dashing the hopes of the Congress.

Asked whether the Haryana results will have an impact on upcoming Maharashtra polls, the Congress chief said, "one election result will not have an impact on election in another state, but the question is why the results were like this, despite people

in our favor₹"

"We could have understood if the opinion was 50:50, with one half saying results will be in our favour and the other half saying otherwise, but despite the entire country including media, channels, print media, leaders and public opinion in our favour, what was the reason behind this result₹We have to find it," he said.

Asked whether there were any doubts regarding the election process, Kharge said he won't comment on it now, and will respond after analysing the booth wise report. (PTI)

Police seize 208 kg of cocaine worth Rs 2,080 crore from west Delhi, second big haul in a week

New Delhi: In the second big drug haul in a week, Delhi Police has seized 208 kg of cocaine worth Rs 2,080 crore from a rented shop in west Delhi, an official said on Thursday evening.

The drugs were hidden inside plastic packets of snacks with 'Tasty Treat' and 'Chatpata Mixture' written on them. About 20-25 such packets kept in cartons were recovered from a small narrow shop in west Delhi's Ramesh Nagar area, the official said.

The seizure is linked to an earlier recovery of 562 kg of drugs worth over Rs 5,000 crore from southwest Delhi's Mahipalpur, he said.

He further said the recovered seizure weighs around 208 kg, which is worth Rs 2.080 crore in international market.

Official sources said the consignment was kept there by an Indian origin UK citizen who is now on the run.

"We got a tip off during investigations of our previous seizure and arrest. On Thursday evening, a team of the Special Cell was sent to the shop and recovered the consignment," a police officer said.

The UK citizen, who is identified by the police, managed to escape before the arrival of the team. He had taken the shop on rent a few days ago, the officer said, adding two people including the owner of the shop have been detained and questioned. The owner told the police that the shop was taken on rent for business related to garments,

the officer said. It is suspected that the UK citizen wanted to transport the drug consignment to other parts of the country but he fled after the police's previous seizure, he said.

The Special Cell, on October 2. had seized over 560 kg of cocaine and 40 kg of hydroponic marijuana estimated to be worth Rs 5,620 crore from a godown in Mahipalpur in south Delhi and arrested four people. Two more persons were subsequently apprehended from Amritsar and Chennai.

Earlier in the day, the Special Cell arrested a man identified as Akhlak, a native of Hapur, Uttar Pradesh. This was the seventh person to be arrested in the case. The police sources said the syndicate was allegedly run by a Dubai-based businessman Virender Basoya. He was allegedly running the racket with the help of Tushar Goyal and Jitender Gill alias Jassi, both arrested by the police, they

The police have also issued a look out circular (LOC) against Basoya, who is on the run. The police suspect that Basoya is a part of an international syndicate which has given

different works to different people. Majority of syndicate members


do not know each other and they were operating on the basis of code names on social media, the police sources said. A senior police officer, who is privy to the investigations, said so far 700 kg of cocaine, worth over Rs 7,000 crore, has been recovered from the national capital so far.

The seizures are the part of same syndicate which which had brought consignment via sea route to Goa from South American countries.

It is suspected some more such consignments are kept or already transported to other destinations, the officer said.

He said the police teams are conducting raids at various parts of Delhi and NCR and trying to nab the other coaccused of the drug syndicate.(PTI)

Teenage girl gang-raped in UP, two arrested



Banda (UP): A 16-year-old girl was allegedly raped by two men here when she was returning home from a fair, police said on Friday. The two accused have been arrested.

The girl had gone to the fair in a neighbouring village with her elder sister on October 7. While the sisters were returning home in the evening, the accused ---Aavesh and Mujibur Rahman -- stopped her, forcibly made her sit in their car and took her to an unknown place where they raped her, Station House

Officer, Pailani police station, Inspector Anand Kumar said. The accused also allegedly pressured her to change her religion. The girl somehow managed to escape and reached home the next morning, the SHO said.

Based on a complaint lodged by the girl's mother, an FIR was lodged in the matter and the girl's medical examination was done, he said.

Kumar said the two accused were arrested on Friday and produced before a court, which sent them to jail. (PTI)

Jharia Man Arrested for Cheating in **CISF Constable Recruitment Exam**

Dhanbad: A man from Jharia has been arrested for using an impersonator in the written exam for the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) constable recruitment conducted by SSC earlier this year. The accused, Ganesh Yadav, was caught during the physical test at Koyla Nagar CISF ground on Tuesday after discrepancies were found in his biometric data.

According to Nalin Kumar

Choubey, a CISF official, the written exam was held on March 6, 2024, where biometric data and photographs of candidates were taken. However, when Ganesh appeared for the physical test on Tuesday, his left thumb impression did not match the biometric records. Additionally, his photograph was found to be different from the one on record. Upon interrogation, Ganesh admitted that he had used an impersonator to take the written exam on his behalf. He was subsequently handed over to the

Saraidhela police. An FIR has been lodged against both Ganesh and the unknown individual who appeared in the exam for him. Police are now investigating the identity of the impersonator and plan to arrest him soon. Ganesh Yadav will be sent to jail on Wednesday.

The authorities are treating the incident as a serious case of fraud and impersonation, undermining the integrity of the recruitment process.

Robbery Gang Arrested at Dhanbad Railway Station: Three Members, Including Woman, Apprehended

Dhanbad: In a significant crackdown, the Railway Protection Force (RPF) on Monday arrested three members of a notorious gang from Dhanbad railway station. The arrested individuals include a woman, while one member of the gang managed to escape. The gang, consisting of six members, has been involved in robbing passengers using drugs to incapacitate their victims. Out of the six, five members hail from Aurangabad, Bihar, and the sixth from Gava.

The gang is reportedly led by Anil Singh, a resident of Dev in Aurangabad, who employed the accused and paid them ₹40,000 per month to carry out the robberies. Among those arrested are Sunaina Devi, Anil Singh's wife, 45-year-old Virendra Singh from Aurangabad, and 20-

year-old Suraj Kumar from Gaya. Sunaina's brother-inlaw, Sunil, managed to escape during the operation.

The breakthrough came after a robbery on September 12 at Dhanbad station. Rajiv Kumar Singh, a resident of Dehri-on-Sone, was waiting for the Ganga-Sutlej Express on platform number two when he was approached by Sunaina, who was wearing a yellow sari. She struck up a conversation with him, while a man loitered nearby. When the train arrived, the three boarded the same bogie, and Sunaina insisted that Rajiv have some cold drink and chips.

Unwillingly, Rajiv consumed a small amount, after which he started feeling drowsy. In a semi-conscious state, he realized his belongings, including a gold ring, ₹25,000 in cash, and his mobile phone,

were being taken from him. He eventually fainted. Upon reaching Dehri-on-Sone, Rajiv was admitted to the subdivisional hospital. After recovering, he returned to Dhanbad on September 29 and began searching for the culprits. On Monday, Rajiv spotted Sunaina wearing the same yellow sari she had worn during the robbery. Recognizing her, he immediately alerted the authorities, leading to the arrest of Sunaina, Virendra, and Suraj. RPF is continuing the search for Sunil, who escaped during the operation.

The gang is believed to be involved in multiple such incidents, preying on passengers across the region. The police are investigating further and are expected to uncover more information about the gang's operations.

Samson ton powers India to 133-run win, 3-0 T20I series sweep against Bangladesh

Hyderabad: Sanju Samson's ebullient maiden T20 International hundred dotted India's resounding 133-run victory and 3-0 series sweep over a listless Bangladesh here on Saturday.

Once India broomed away records like rotten twigs while posting 297 for 6 after electing to bat, it was always a case of eventual margin of win and Bangladesh never really offered a meaningful fight, ending up at 164/7 in the third and final T20I. Pacer Mayank Yadav (2/32) and leg-spinner Ravi Bishnoi (3/30) led the hosts' bowling effort.

Samson (111, 47 balls, 11x4, 8x6), who hammered the second fastest T20I century by an Indian after Rohit Sharma (35 balls), and skipper Suryakumar Yadav (75, 35 balls, 8x4, 5x6), biffed 173 runs during an electrifying second wicket stand, propelling the hosts past several records.

The total was second in the alltime list of the highest T20I team totals behind Nepal's 314 and ahead of Afghanistan's 278/3, and also India's highest in the shortest format.

They were purely amazing stats even taking into account a barren pitch and lighting quick outfield. But beyond that cold realm of numbers, Samson's innings was touched by his esoteric genius, the ingredient that makes him compelling and frustrating in



equal measure.

But the Kerala right-hander chose to display his captivating side on the field on a clement Hyderabad night and Bangladesh withered quickly.

Samson needed a big effort after lukewarm outings in the first two matches in Gwalior and New Delhi and, oh boy, did he make it count here!

Samson's brand-new purpose found an immediate on-field expression as he pummelled pacer Taskin Ahmed for four consecutive fours -- two cover drives and as many flicks -- in the second over of the innings.

It was the perfect teaser for the blockbuster action that unfolded in the next 10.3 overs.

The rapid start also helped India

move past the early dismissal of opener Abhishek Sharma (4), falling to a poorly-timed pull off slinger quick Tanzim Hasan.

Suryakumar was a mere spectator once Samson slipped into top gear with an array of mind-spinning shots. That could be the biggest tribute for the 29-year-old's knock.

Suryakumar to shade in T20Is but Samson did that with a knock of rare brilliance as India raced to 82 for 1 in Power Play and 152 for 1 after 10 overs.

No bowler was spared during the batting extravaganza that was based on the single-minded and simple philosophy of naked aggression.

It was so glaring in the 10th over when leg-spinner Rishad Hossain came to bowl. Hossain erred in line and length and Samson creamed him for five consecutive sixes, including a 105-meter monster.

But the most stunning shot in Samson's innings was a six off the backfoot off pacer Mustafizur Rahman.

Waiting deep inside the crease, Samson judged the slower ball to perfection, and whacked it over extra cover for a maximum, eliciting a dejected shrug and shake of head from the experienced bowler.

Soon, he brought up his hundred off 40 balls with a boundary off off-spinner Mahedi Hasan and celebrated with a roar and punch before getting melted into a tight embrace by his captain.

Suryakumar reminded the gallery of his presence, smashing Tanzim for three fours and a six while reaching his fifty in 23 halls

But both the batters fell in the space of adding 10 runs. Samson was jettisoned by Mustafizur's well-directed bouncer and Suryakumar became Mahmudullah's last T20I victim, giving a simple catch to Rishad in deep.

But by then India had reached 206 for three in the 15th over.

That itself was a daunting total but Hardik Pandya (47, 18 balls, 4x4, 4x6) and Riyan Parag (34, 13 balls, 1x4, 4x6) flogged the dead horse to milk a further 70 runs for the fourth wicket as India raced to a massive total.

Once Mayank ousted Pervez Hossain in the first ball of Bangladesh innings, they struggled for momentum in the always futile chase of 298.

The tourists did not have the resources even to attempt a powerful chase as knocks by Towhid Hridoy (63 not out, 42 balls, 5x4, 3x6) and Litton Das (42, 25 balls, 8x4) remained distant specks in the match's scoresheet. (PTI)

Peru upsets Uruguay 1-0 and ends winless run in South American World Cup qualifying

World's best team India lets you know where you've to improve: Nick Pothas

Hyderabad: Bangladesh fielding coach Nick Pothas on Friday admitted that "world's best team" India put his side under tremendous pressure throughout the Test and T20I series, but he wants to leverage it as a learning experience.

Bangladesh came to India riding high on their recent Test series win over Pakistan, but were quickly brought down to earth by the home side, emphatically grabbing both Test and T20I rubbers.

"When you look at the bowling and the batting, one thing India will always do to you is put you under immense pressure because of the level of skill they have. India lets you know where you have to improve," said Pothas in the pre-match press meet here.

India won the first two matches at Gwalior and New Delhi to take an unassailable 2-0 lead,



rendering the third T20I here on Saturday inconsequential.

But Pothas said Bangladesh need to be "honest" in their selfassessment after such a tour where they suffered some heavy defeats.

"We are very fortunate to be touring India because you can get a lot of learning done. And the learning has to be honest. The learning is how do you absorb pressure for longer periods of time?"

"How do you read the game better under pressure for longer periods of time₹ But most importantly is now do you prepare₹ And that has to evolve, that has to change all the time," he added.

"But it is a privilege to play in India because when you play the world's best team, they help you understand where you need to improve."

Pothas held "underperforming" batsmen responsible for his side's defeat in the three-match T20I series against India.

"We are playing against a phenomenal opposition in their own country. Yes, we have some experience along the way but I agree with you, from a batting point of view, we have underperformed according to our expectation.

"You can take performance and an outcome as two different conversations but, yes, we would have liked to get 170, 180 here," he noted

Shakib Al Hasan and

Mahmudullah will soon retire from international cricket, and Pothas hoped that the veterans would be around Bangladesh cricket to pass on their wisdom to coming generation.

"I would imagine having played international cricket for the length of time they have and performed to the high level that they have, I think the most important thing that we need to acknowledge is that they have forged a path for young cricketers to follow.

"With any luck they are going to be around to help in whatever capacity but to be able to pass on that experience to make the next generation better.

"Bangladesh has been very fortunate to have cricketers of their calibre play for that length of time and as a group and as a country we wish them the best of luck," he said.(PTI)
