

ALL FIVE TRADING DAYS END IN RED

Indian stock market caught in the grip of bearish trend, yet again

he Indian stock market once again fell into the grip of a bearish trend last week. All five trading days of the week ended in the red, marking the biggest weekly decline in the past two years. The impact of the downturn is evident from the fact that all sectors on the index showed a decline, with some sectors facing such deep falls that recovery could take time. Foreign Institutional Investors (FII) played a significant role in this decline, as they sold stocks worth ₹15,828.11 crore. On the other hand, Domestic Institutional

Investors (DII) attempted to stabilize the market by buying ₹11,873.92 crore worth of stocks.

> The downturn has once again conveyed a crucial message to investors who were riding high on the bullish trend: profits are not just made by the increase in share prices but only when those profits are reflected in the bank account. At present, it is uncertain when the next phase of a bull market will begin, largely due to the ongoing turmoil in international markets. Since the U.S. and Europe will be on holiday during the last week of December for



Christmas, it is assumed that there might not be further sharp declines in the Indian markets. However, the chances of a market recovery in the short term seem equally slim. Traders believe that fluctuations will continue in the remaining days of December, and investors should focus on

companies with strong fundamentals. Whenever possible, they should seize partial investment opportunities. Given the current circumstances, investments made cautiously in the market will provide opportunities to earn profits.

On Friday, the market witnessed such a severe

downturn that even the most patient investors lost their calm. The BSE index recorded a decline of 4,091.52 points (4.98%) and closed at 78,041.59 points. Similarly, the NSE Nifty index dropped by 1,180.80 points (4.77%) and closed at 23,587.50 points.

The decline was also reflected in the midcap and smallcap indices. However, it is noteworthy that these indices closed with slightly lesser losses compared to the main indices, which suggests a potential recovery in the future. In the current situation, expectations are highest from select mid-

cap and largecap stocks. As for the bullion market, international weakness led to a decline in the prices of gold and silver this week. In Jaipur's Sarrafa market last week, the price of 24-carat gold fell by ₹500 per 10 grams, reaching ₹78,300 per 10 grams, compared to ₹78,800 per 10 grams the previous Saturday. Silver also saw a drop of ₹2,500 per kilogram, falling to ₹89,600 per kilogram

Traders predict more volatility in the market this week. They suggest that the monthly settlement of futures markets is also approaching, and hence, the market direction will likely become clearer only after December.

Karnataka woman minister who has senior BJP leader in a spot is no pushover: Meet Laxmi Hebbalkar

ne of the commonly narrated stories about Karnataka Congress leader Laxmi Hebbalkar, 49, when she first emerged as a candidate for the Assembly elections over a decade ago in the Belagavi region, was that she had been identified by the Congress top brass as a leader for the future at a conference of young party leaders. The two-time MLA and Congress loyalist – who lost the state polls in 2013 and the Lok Sabha polls in 2014 from Belagavi – is now the sole woman minister in the Siddaramaiah-led Congress government in Karnataka on the back of two successive poll victories from the Belgaum Rural constituency in the 2018 and 2023 state polls. Over her years in public life, the state women and child development minister has shown a feisty streak below her demure demeanor. As president of the Karnataka Pradesh Congress Committee's women's unit from 2015 to 2018, Hebbalkar was at the forefront of many public agitations in Karnataka, and faced her share of controversies. In the latest one, Hebbalkar has accused BJP MLC C T Ravi, 58, of using a derogatory term against her during a round of verbal jousting on the floor of the Legislative Council by the Congress and BJP MLCs over remarks made in Parliament by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Dr B R Ambedkar. Terms like "drug addict" and "murderer" are reported to have been exchanged by the two sides before Ravi allegedly used the term under contention repeatedly against Hebbalkar. Never one to turn away from a battle for women's issues, Hebbalkar took Ravi head-on and filed a complaint of sexual harassment against him. The Belagavi police arrested Ravi on Thursday night, though he has since secured bail. The Congress leadership has rallied behind Hebbalkar. "The words uttered by C T Ravi are an insult to women as a whole," Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar, who is also the state Congress president, said.

When a big win means big problems A month on after results, Mahayuti is struggling



From govt formation to swearingin to now the delayed portfolio allocation, the BJP-led alliance has portrayed a picture of confusion and infighting.



t the week-long Winter a Session of the Maharashtra Assembly in Nagpur that ended on Saturday, the euphoria of the Mahayuti's landslide victory was short lived. Instead, coalition conflict in the ruling alliance played out in the open, including the fact that the BJP, Shiv Sena and NCP are yet to work out portfolio distribution nearly a month

after the results were declared on November 23. In the absence of a clear redressal mechanism, these issues may linger. What has been more surprising is the otherwise disciplined BJP's failure to stem the confusion that has prevailed despite the big win, starting with even swearing-in of the top three (Chief Minister and

the two Deputy CMs) and then that of other ministers. Officially, there has been no explanation forthcoming, but BJP watchers are surprised at how the party has allowed junior allies Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar to play hard ball.

Officially, Fadnavis has maintained, "There are absolutely no differences. Everything is decided. And all three parties are working as a team." However, sources admitted that with all three Mahayuti parties winning Assembly seats beyond their expectations, all of them are facing a problem of plenty. A senior BJP functionary pointed out, "With the BJP winning 132 seats on its own, Sena chief Shinde knew he stood no chance of retaining the CM's post. So, he pitched for the crucial Home ministry, which the BJP blatantly refused... Meanwhile, NCPchief Pawar has been unbudging on his demand for the Finance Ministry." There is also a tussle over other crucial portfolios such as the Public Works Department, Energy, Housing and Industries.

A political strategist in the BJP



said, "When you have a coalition government, conflicts are in-built. Every decision takes time as you have to strike a consensus that requires adjustments and compromises... Apart from that, each party including the BJP had a tough time shortlisting candidates. There were at least 36 strong contenders for ministerial berths, of whom only 19 made it to the Cabinet." The Shinde Sena has 57 expectant MLAs and Ajit Pawar's NCP 41.

"Under one-party rule, the matter is resolved in minutes. With three parties, there are issues that require central leadership's intervention," a party insider said.

tion issues, the BJP's decision to drop four sitting ministers, including senior leader Sudhir Mungantiwar, was not hassle free.

In the NCP too, senior leader Chhagan Bhujbal publicly expressed his disappointment after being denied a Cabinet berth. "I stood by the OBCs at a time when there were attacks from all sides. I fought activist Manoj Jarange Patil, who

was seeking Maratha reservation in the OBC quota. I think the denial of a minister post is the reward for my hard work," Bhujbal said. The Sena hasn't been immune either, with former minister Tanaji Sawant saying, "I was promised a Cabinet minister post, which was not kept." An unhappy Sawant also replaced his Shiv Sena social media profile picture with a photo of party founder Bal Thackeray.

Another former minister Vijay Shivtare said, "I am upset at how I have been treated."

After the poll results gave Mahayuti as many as 230 of the total 288 seats, leaving just 46 for the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi, questions had been raised over the potential efficacy of the Opposition. However, now the notes of dissent within the Mahayuti are resonating far louder. Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray underlined, "With such a magnificent victory, one would expect rejoicing. What has come to the fore is discontent and differences within Mahayuti."

The Supreme Court on Friday granted bail to two more former members of the Uttar Pradesh Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC), including an 82-year-old, whose acquittals by the trial court in the Hashimpura massacre case were reversed by the Delhi High Court. A bench of

Justices A S Oka and A G Masih noted that they had spent six years in prison after the high court overturned their acquittal in 2018. On December 6,



the Supreme Court gave bail to eight convicts in the case, all of whom were former members of the PAC.

PM Modi brought peace to northeastern states by signing 20 peace accords: Shah

NEW DELHI: Union home minister Amit Shah on Saturday said Prime Minister Narendra Modi brought peace in the northeastern regions by signing 20 peace accords in the last 10 years of his tenure, which led 9,000 armed militants to surrender. Shah said time has come for change in approach of the police to tackle and eliminate insurgency in the northeastern regions.

Addressing the 72nd plenary of the North Eastern Council (NEC) in Tripura, Shah further said that connectivity was no longer a problem in the region as the Centre "has spent Rs 81,000 crore for rail connectivity and Rs 41,000 crore for road network in the northeastern states."

"The police fought insurgency in the northeast for the past four decades. As insurgency has now ended, we need to change the approach of the force to ensure people get justice



within three years of lodging FIRs," the Union home minister was quoted as saying by news agency PTI.

Shah said northeast was always one of the key areas for the central government's developmental works as Union ministers "spent 700 nights" in the states of the northeastern regions since coming to power in 2014. "After the exchange of enclaves (land boundary agreements) with Bangladesh, the whole world will open for the northeast. This will change the investment ecosystem in the region," he said. The Unioh home minister also highlighted the efforts being put towards the upliftment of people in rural areas by promoting vegetable cultivation, milk, eggs and meat production.

"Only a hike in the GSDP (Gross State Domestic Product) is not enough for overall development. There is a need to attain self-sufficiency in vegetables, milk, eggs and meat," he said. He said that central government has been focusing on organic cultivation in the region "The Centre has already constituted the National Organic Corporation Ltd to boost the sector. I urge all the CMs (in the northeast) to sign agree-

Reddy's remarks came after AIMIM MLA Akbaruddin Owaisi raised the issue in the Assembly. Referring to videos circulating on social media, Reddy criticised Allu Arjun for holding a roadshow and waving to the crowd despite the large gathering, which led to chaos. Reddy stated that the management of the theatre had submitted a request to the



police on December 2, seeking security for the visit of top actors and others on December 4. However, the police rejected the request due to concerns about managing the crowd. Before entering the theatre and upon exiting, the actor was seen waving to the crowd from the sunroof of his car, prompting thousands of fans to gather and push to catch a glimpse of him, Reddy noted. The CM also took aim at film personalities who, after Allu Arjun's arrest, visited his residence but did not show the same empathy for the young boy who is currently Arjun.


