# The biggest nuclear deal of the 21st century was signed between PM Modi and Trump

- The US will install several reactors one after the other in India
- Many issues were discussed between PM Modi and US President Trump.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi has completed his two-day US visit.
- The US has also shown interest in building advanced small modular reactors in India.

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has completed his two-day US visit on 14 February. This was the first time PM Modi visited the US after Donald Trump became the President of America for the second time.

On the last day of his visit, PM Modi met US President Donald Trump. Many issues were discussed between the two leaders. Many agreements were also reached between the two countries on many other issues including trade, energy sector, nuclear reactors. A joint PC was also held after the meeting of the two leaders.

Talks between India & America on nuclear energy Keeping energy security in mind during the US visit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Donald Trump have reaffirmed their belief in nuclear energy. In fact, after the talks between the two leaders at the White House on Thursday, they reiterated their commitment to work together on US-designed nuclear reactors in India through large-scale localization and possible technology transfer.

During the joint briefing, PM Modi and Trump



welcomed the announcements of Budget 2025 to amend the Atomic Energy Act and the Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act (CLNDA) for nuclear reactors.

According to this statement, it was also decided to establish a bilateral arrangement in accordance with the CLNDA, which will address the issue of civil liability and facilitate cooperation between Indian and US industry in the production and deployment of nuclear reactors US NSA also spoke to PM Modi

PM Modi also met with US Security Advisor Michael Waltz on Thursday. During the meeting, the two leaders discussed industrial cooperation and civil nuclear energy, with an emphasis on small modular reactors.

#### What did the Indian Foreign Secretary say?

After the end of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's US visit, Indian Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said that an agreement has been reached between the two countries to realize the possibilities in civilian nuclear energy, build US-designed nuclear reactors in India and take this process forward through large-scale localization as well as technology transfer.

The Foreign Secretary said that the two countries have been discussing cooperation in small modular reactors for some time and it was discussed again today. The obstacles in realizing this cooperation due to some legal provisions existing in India in the past years have already

#### America preparing to install reactors in India

Let us tell you that the Government of India and Westinghouse are also discussing the project to build six 1,000 MW nuclear reactors in Kovvada, Andhra Pradesh.

At the same time, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump have also talked about giving the reactor designed by the US to India and building reactors in India by transferring technology.

#### **Civil nuclear agreement will gain momentum**

Let us inform you that historic civil nuclear agreements were signed between India and the US in 2008. There has been no progress in the talks since then. No new US nuclear reactor has reached Indian soil in the 21st century. Now to end the deadlock between the two countries, both the leaders have now shown interest not only in building large reactors but also in building advanced small modular reactors in India.

During her speech, Nirmala Sitharaman said that the development of at least 100 gigawatts of nuclear power by 2047 is "essential to our energy transition efforts.

#### **In Shorts Meeting on 17th to choose new Chief Election Commissioner**

New Delhi: A meeting is going to be held on February 17 to elect the new Chief Election Commissioner.

CEC Rajiv Kumar is going to retire on February 18. It is reported that officer Gyanesh Kumar is leading the race

for this top post. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Law Minister Arjun Meghwal and Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi will be present in the meeting. The panel is likely to send a list of five shortlisted candidates for the top post. According to sources, the search panel has selected five names from more than 480 candidates.

#### **Illegal immigrants from America will land in Amritsar** on 15,16th February



New Delhi: Prime Minister Modi has left for India after completing his US tour. Meanwhile, the crackdown on illegal immigrants in America is ongoing. It has been reported that a flight carrying illegal immigrants from America will land in Amritsar on 15th February and another on 16th February. According to sources, there will be 119 Indians in the flight arriving on 15th February, including 67 from Punjab and 33 from Haryana. The new batch of illegal immigrants from America is arriving at a time when the opposition in India is raising this issue.

## Coal dues of Rs 1.36 lakh crore on Central Government

Ranchi: Jharkhand government will form a high power committee of officials to recover the state's

dues of Rs 1.36 lakh crore in the coal royalty head from the Central Government and the remaining amount of special assistance grant.

After mutual consultation with the government and taking the consent of Chief

Minister Hemant Soren, the committee will proceed for talks towards recovery of dues. The state government has also made preparations that as per the need, law can also be resorted to in

For this, the services of experts will also be taken. State Finance Minister Radhakrishna Kishore recently met Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and Coal Minister G Krishna Reddy in Delhi and raised a demand to this effect.

He was assured that the central government would take necessary initiatives in this direction. Accordingly, the officials of the Coal Ministry were directed to work in mutual coordination with the officials of the state government.

The state government was also asked to cooperate in this direction. A team of senior officials will take necessary steps to resolve this complex issue. Finance Minister Radhakrishna Kishore said that action will be taken towards taking the rights of the state.

Further action will be taken in this regard after taking the consent of Chief Minister Hemant Soren. He has discussed with the officials in this regard. In Delhi, the Union Ministers have assured him that the payment will be made after actual assessment of the dues. This initiative is expected to resolve the matter.

The state government has mentioned to the Center that a total of Rs 1,36,042 crore is due.

# NIA team to visit US for extradition of Mumbai terror attack conspirator Tahawwur Rana

New Delhi: US approval has been received to extradite 26/11 Mumbai terror attack mastermind Tahawwur Hussain Rana. After this, a team of National Investigation Agency (NIA) will soon visit the US to bring him back. The investigating agency has prepared a five-member team led by an Inspector General level officer for the repatriation process.

In this regard, an official said, "The NIA team has got approval from the Ministry of Home Affairs as well as the Ministry of External Affairs in this direction and the team will leave soon." Rana's extradition to India was approved by the new US administration of Donald Trump. Former Special Director of Intelligence



Bureau (IB) Yashovardhan Jha Azad said that the announcement of Tahawwur Rana's extradition is very important for India. Azad said, "He was one of the main accused in the terror attack. For the first time, an accused of the Mumbai terror attack will be extradited. This is very important." Azad said, "India has been trying to extradite Rana from the US for a long

time. In such a situation, this is a big success for India." Earlier, Rana's extradition was announced in a joint statement issued after the meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump in Washington DC. The joint statement said, "Given the shared desire to bring those who harm our citizens to justice, the US has announced that it has approved the extradition of Tahawwur Rana to India."

Let us tell you that on January 21, the US Supreme Court rejected the review petition against the extradition of 63-year-old Rana. Pakistani-origin Canadian businessman Rana is accused of playing a key role in the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks.

## **Bihar number 1 in** pressing NOTA button

New Delhi: According to the data of the Election Commission, voting on NOTA in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections has decreased as compared to the last two general elections. At the same time, the maximum NOTA button has been pressed in Bihar. The 'None of the Above' (NOTA) option in the Electronic Voting Machine (EVM) got the lowest vote percentage in the last Lok Sabha elections since its introduction in 2013.

This information has come to light from the data of the Election Commission. The NOTA option was first implemented in the 2014 Lok Sabha elections. According to the Commission's book 'Atlas-2024', there has been a gradual decline in NOTA votes in the last three Lok Sabha elections, from 1.08 percent in 2014 to 0.99 percent in 2024. This vote percentage may seem small, but the votes received by 'NOTA' can be important in those seats

where the margin of victory is less.

The highest share (percentage) of NOTA votes was recorded in Bihar at 2.07 per cent, followed by Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu at 2.06 per cent and Gujarat at 1.58 per cent. In contrast, Nagaland recorded the lowest share of NOTA votes at just 0.21 per cent. Such varying trends across states may be influenced by factors such as political competition, prominence of regional parties, voter education and the overall electoral scenario within each region.

# Delhi may get BJP government by 20th February

**Delhi:** BJP is in full swing regarding the formation of a new government in the national capital Delhi. If party sources are to be believed, the date of the swearing-in ceremony will be finalized as soon as the CM face is announced. Senior party sources said that a meeting of the legislative party can be called from 16 to 18 February. Not only this, after getting the final approval of PM Modi on the CM face, the swearing-in ceremony can be organized on 19 or 20 February. There are discussions about many places regarding the venue of the swearing-in ceremony. However,



there is a high possibility of this ceremony being organized at Ramlila Maidan.

According to information received from party sources, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is returning to New Delhi after ending his two-day visit to America.

After this, observers will be appointed to select the name of the Chief Minister. Sources said that a meeting of the party's legislative party can be held during 16 to 18 February. In this, the name of the Chief Minister will be proposed and after approval, the senior leaders of the party will announce the new Chief Minister of

Party sources said that the swearing-in ceremony of the new government in Delhi can be held on 19 or 20 February. The place where the swearing-in ceremony will be held has

not been decided yet. However, party sources have indicated that the Chief Minister of Delhi will be elected from among the MLAs.

Agenda set for 100 days

Rajouri Garden MLA Manjinder Singh Sirsa said that I think after the swearing-in ceremony, the new government will be formed by February 20. The new government will start working around February 19 or 20. Sirsa further said that providing clean drinking water, ensuring cleanliness in the city and starting work to deal with air and Yamuna pollution will be the priorities of the new government within 100 days.



In the executive category, E-1 to E-3 will get twenty thousand rupees, E-4, E-5 will get thirty thousand rupees, E6-E7 will get thirty five thousand rupees, E8-E9 will get forty thousand rupees and board level officers will get maximum fifty thousand rupees as spectacles reimbursement once

in two years. Senior citizen and social worker Hare Ram Pandit believes that retired coal officers and employees need more treatment for their eyes and the spectacles used in it.Pandit says that Coal India management should provide the facility of spectacles reimbursement (payment of the cost of spectacles) to retired coal officers and employees under CPR MSE and CPR M SNE once in two years as is being given to working officers and employees under MAT Rules. Pension-receiving coal employees and officers are facing financial difficulties.

# Police arrested four criminals of an inter-state gang who used to snatch money after withdrawing money from the bank

In the sensational incident of **⊥** snatching after withdrawing money from the bank in the district, the police took immediate action and arrested four criminals of the inter-state gang. Three mobile phones, a tool for breaking the trunk, three motorcycles and other items have been recovered from these criminals.

In this regard, the Deputy Superintendent of Police Chas Praveen Kumar Singh informed the press that on November 26 last year, Jagdish Manjhi, father-Late Mohan Manjhi, resident of village-Kurma, Post-Kashi Jharia, Police Station-Pindrajora, was returning home on a motorcycle with his nephew after withdrawing a total of Rs 28,000 from



Bank of India Baghmara. During this time, two unknown Pulsar motorcycle riders snatched money and bank related documents from him near Reliance Petrol Pump located at NH-32 Talgadia turn under Chira Chas Police Station and fled. In this regard, FIR number-92/2024 was registered in Chira Chas Police

Station. During the investigation, on the basis of secret information, raids were conducted and the non-bailable accused involved in the case were arrested.

On their information, documents related to the looted bank, other important papers, the motorcycle used in the incident and Rs 4,000 were recovered.

The arrested accused are named as Prakash Das, father-Lakhbider Das, Village-Muskhatal Madasi Pada, No. 4 Bhanga Cabin, Purushottampur Deepak Rao, father-Mahaveer Rao, Village-Sheikhpura, Post and Police Station-Panduwa, District-Hooghly, West Bengal Arjun Rao alias Kushal Rao alias Kush, father-Jagannath Rao, present address-Village Sheikhpukur, Post and Police Station-Panduwa, District-Hooghly, West Bengal Permanent address-Village Purvokot, Police Station-Korai, District-Jajpur, Odisha Vikram Rao, father-Vishwanath Rao, Village-Sheikhpukur, Post and Police Station-Panduwa, District-Hooghly, West Bengal. The police recovered 3 Android

mobiles, 3 motorcycles, an iron T-shaped tool used for breaking the trunk of motorcycles and an iron hammer from them. The SDPO said that several criminal cases are registered against the arrested accused in various districts in the past, which include robbery, burglary and other serious crimes. A list of various police station cases related to the names of the accused has been enclosed. The policemen involved in the raiding team include Chandan Kumar Dubey, Police Station Incharge Chira Chas, Raj Kapoor Seth, Chira Chas Police Station, Sandeep Kumar Balidih Police Station, Nitish Kumar, Chas Mu. Police Station, Armed forces including Dhiren Kumar were involved.

#### Mother had gone to take bath in Kumbh! Blood-soaked son kept screaming, died, police engaged in investigation

Mother had gone for Kumbh bath, bloodsoaked son kept pleading for help outside the house but no one helped. Rajesh Kumar's mother has gone to Prayagraj for Kumbh bath. While one of Rajesh's brothers is in jail. There are deep wounds in many places on Rajesh's body, after which the police suspect that he has been murdered. Police has taken action in the entire case and registered an FIR under murder sections and has taken the body into custody and sent it for postmortem. The railway track is about 100 meters away from the place where Rajesh's house is and the body was recovered. Police has recovered CCTV footage related to the incident.Medininagar Town Police Station in-charge Devvrat Poddar



said that after seeing the crime scene and the dead body, it seems that the youth has been murdered. On the basis of the statement of the local ward councilor, an FIR has been registered under sections of murder and the entire case is being investigated. He said that the police have received many information from the CCTV footage. The railway track is at a short distance from the youth's house, even in an injured state, the youth crawled to his door. At the door, the youth screamed and shouted for help for a long time. Later the youth died.

**Pruning:** Generally, you have to prune the roots and the foliage. Pruning bonsais is one of the more enjoyable aspects of growing bonsais.

Pruning roots: Due to small containers, bonsai roots are stunted in growth. By pruning roots, you will ensure that there is space for the new roots to grow, which is critical for the health and growth of the bonsai. Prune roots twice a year and change the soil when it's done.

Pruning Foliage: This is vital for aesthetic purposes. Workout a specific design in the mind for your tree and shape it into the form you desire. Removing dead leaves help keep it healthy and

Shaping: To create a desired shape, you can use a wire (copper wires are the best) to assist the branches to grow as per your design. Make sure that the wire is of the right thickness and does not break the branches. Hold the branch you are wiring in both hands and carefully wind the wire around it. 3. Select the plants which can be easily trimmed

and shaped, and ones with a rough bark. 4. For the flower and fruit bonsais, four to five

hours of direct sunlight is essential. 5. Avoid too much of watering. Alternate days are

good enough. 6. Ready-made bonsais are available. Plant them into containers with the given steps

# The many ways America first hurts global trade

When he visits Washington tomorrow, Narendra Modi would need to bank on the excellent personal relationship he enjoys with Donald Trump to stave off possibilities of higher tariffs on more exports from India. Last week, Trump announced plans to impose 'reciprocal tariffs' on many countries, with indications that India could be in the crosshairs. This week, he imposed across-the-board tariffs on steel and aluminium imports that affect India too; but it's not targeted at India alone.

The announcements signal a major escalation of Trump's strategy to dismantle the existing trade order and reshape relationships in keeping with his 'America First' policy. It supports the unilateral use of trade policy instruments to protect the "American economy, the American worker, and national security interests". It disregards the principles of fair play that form the basis of the multilaterally agreed rules for the orderly conduct of global trade. The intent of the new US administration is hardly surprising, as Trump has underlined that "the most important element of [his] plan to make America extraordinarily wealthy again is reciprocity". The first set of tariffs was announced last month against three countries—Canada, Mexico and China. Though the implementation of a 25 percent tariff hike for the US's two neighbours was postponed by a month, the 10 percent hike on China is being levied.In several ways, the America First trade policy is not only an extension, but is a significantly more potent form of trade unilateralism that Trump had pursued during his first term in office. Even before he assumed charge this time, Trump had promised to rewrite trade agreements "to achieve or maintain the general level of reciprocal and mutually advantageous concessions". He had declared that his administration would impose "reciprocal tariffs" on India, arguing, "[I]f they tax us, we tax them the same amount. They tax us. We tax them. And they tax us. Almost in all cases, they're taxing us, and we haven't been taxing them". Trump has clearly been targeting India's relatively higher tariffs and has in the past labelled the country as the "tariff king". Trump's commerce secretary Howard Lutnick emphasised during his recent Senate confirmation hearings that reciprocity was "going to be a key topic for the Trump administration". He favoured the use of across-the-board import taxes to strong-arm trade partners into lowering their tariffs on US exports.

Trump's threat puts at serious risk the agreements on tariff liberalisation that the US entered into with WTO members while acceding to the multilateral trading system. These agreements took into consideration the ability and institutional capacities of countries to adopt lower tariffs, and allowed developing countries like India to maintain relatively higher tariffs to prevent disruption in sensitive sectors.

Thus, India imposes higher tariffs on major agriculture commodities, especially foodgrains, to ensure adequate availability at home, protect the livelihoods of small farmers and promote self-sufficiency. Now, in the name of reciprocity, India could face pressure to lower its high tariffs on farm products, to bring them down to the levels the US imposes. But India must argue that the US never used tariffs to protect its agricultural sector, since the sector has historically benefited from high subsidies that kept prices well below those in the international markets. This would be the foremost challenge of the Modi government.

India may also be targeted as the US president has directed his administration to investigate the causes of US's "large and persistent annual trade deficits in goods, as well as the economic and national security implications and risks resulting from such deficits, and recommend appropriate measures, such as a global supplemental tariff or other policies, to remedy such deficits". India maintains a trade surplus with the US, which has more than doubled during the past five years from \$17 billion in 2019-20 to \$35 billion in 2023-24.

# The urgent need for a national skill census

India's demographic dividend is a fleeting opportunity that must be used in time. A few states have attempted a skill census, but the scale and complexity of a national one demand a concerted effort

India's demographic transition will see it emerge as the most populous nation in the working age group by 2030. However, while the overall unemployment rate is only 4.1 percent, youth unemployment remains a serious issue at above 12 percent. The situation is further enervated by the low share of 4.7 percent of the total workforce having been trained. A National Skill Census might help fill this gap. While caste-based census issues have taken most of the political discourse, Karnataka 2023, along with Haryana and Maharashtra 2024, have found their voters focusing more on jobs, development and safety. The MSME is rising to challenges with schemes like 'Approaches for MSME Development 2024' and a new executive development programme aimed at reducing the skill gap. The India Skills Report 2024 emphasises how skill will determine global competitiveness and inclusive growth, especially with AI steering the future of work in the MSME sector. As of 2020, the Uttar Pradesh government mapped skills within the migrant worker population of about 2.35 million, identifying a skills matrix to facilitate fit job placements for those returning home. The survey incorporated the mapping of 94 categories of labourers to match workers with MSME organisations. In such amicable terms with major industry bodies like the Indian Industry Association and the Confederation of Indian Industry, jobs were promised for about 11.5 lakh workers, with 2.5 lakh by the real estate sector and 7 lakh provided by other sectors.

In May 2021, the Migration and Mobility Partnership Agreement was signed by India and the UK to facilitate legal movement of students and professionals. By 2024, cooperation was focused on scaffolding skills. An important initiative was connecting India's National Career Service portal with the UK job platform.

India and the UAE launched a pilot project to align India's skill development programmes with UAE's job requirements. The NSDC partnered with the UAE's Ministry of Human Resources and Emiratisation to standardise qualifications. In October 2024, the Andhra Pradesh government initiated India's first-ever skill census, which began in the Mangalagiri constituency and Thullur mandal. The initiative was aimed at analysing skill sets across 1,63,421 families to promote employment opportunities and bridge gaps between industry and workforce skills. The data gathering efforts were led by some 675 enumerators with an app called Naipunyam, targeting individuals aged 18-40.

What hampered the pilot run of the app was data collection. To gather the information, the enumerators were supposed to make candidates login with authentication through OTP, but many candidates refused to cooperate and provide their OTPs to the enumerators, thereby slowing down the process. The scale and complexity of a national skill census demand a concerted effort involving key stakeholders. The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE), NITI Aayog and state skill development missions must spearhead this initiative, supported by industry associations. Educational institutions, vocational training centers, and international organisations like UNESCO and the World Bank can provide technical expertise and funding.

To ensure its success, the census must be executed over three years at an estimated cost of '3,000-5,000 crore.

A Skill India Commission must be established under the MSDE to oversee the census, which should be conducted biennially. A robust survey structure incorporating demographic data, skill categories, and employment trends is crucial. Develop a digital platform akin to Singapore's SkillsFuture portal, incorporating AI for real-time analytics, multilingual support, and offline accessibility to cater to rural populations. A phased rollout across states and Union Territories will ensure manageability and adaptability. Collaborate with industries to design skilling programmes that address market demands, taking cues from Australia's Job Outlook tool to match skills with labour market trends. Establish an independent monitoring body for real-time progress tracking and impact assessments.India's demographic dividend is not a perpetual boon—it is a fleeting opportunity. Without urgent and decisive action, the country risks squandering its potential, perpetuating cycles of unemployment and underemployment. A national skill census is not just a policy option, it is an economic and moral imperative. The time to act is now. Policymakers, industries, and civil society must rally together to ensure India's youth are not merely participants in the workforce but architects of a prosperous future.

## Wilful violation: On the Tamil Nadu Governor's conduct

#### Cutting down on imports a big challenge

The Supreme Court of India's probing questions to the Tamil Nadu Governor, R.N. Ravi, have exposed a pattern of wilful violation of constitutional duty on his part. The questions related to the lawfulness of Mr. Ravi's act in referring to the President of India a set of



The A-G also maintained that when the Governor had earlier withheld assent, the Bills ceased to exist and the Assembly had presumed that these had been "returned" by the Governor and adopted them a second time. In a related contention, he has also argued that the

requirement to return a Bill does not hold good if the issue of repugnancy is noted. These arguments may appear fascinating in determining the right course of action to be followed by Governors in dealing with

Bills, and the Bench, which has reserved its judgment, may come up with answers. However, the fact that the Governor has been using his powers to scuttle legislation is quite obvious. He had not acted on some of these Bills for a year or two or expressed his reservations relating to the repugnancy aspect while withholding assent. Also, he ignored the fact that he was bound to grant assent when the Bills were presented to him a second time, but referred them to the President. Even in a 2023 hearing, the Court had questioned whether a Governor, having chosen to withhold assent, could exercise another option by referring the same Bill to the President. Mr. Ravi

appears bent on scuttling any law that does not suit his world view. It is time the Union government took note of the challenge his continuance in office poses to constitutional governance in Tamil Nadu.

# When the prime minister goes to Washington

### Trump is yet to fill some key posts that have a bearing on India-US relations. For now, the two sides are talking at higher levels to reset the course

What do Indian prime ministers and US presidents talk about when they have summit meetings, which have become regular only in the last 25 of the 77 years since independence? Quite often, they lean on each other's shoulders to share experiences because it is quite lonely at the top for those holding high offices.

Barack Obama and Narendra Modi easily broke ice at their first meeting in the residential East Wing of the White House in September 2014, contrary to expectations among aides on both sides. They did this by effortlessly finding common ground as leaders of their respective countries who had stepped into high offices as rank outsiders in their capitals. Modi had never held any elected public office in New Delhi until he became prime minister. Obama was only a first-time senator who had not even completed his term when he was elected president. There was a time when American presidents were condescending and talked down to Indian prime ministers. When Indira Gandhi and Ronald Reagan met for the first time in Cancun in 1981, the president spent most of their 45-minute meeting lecturing the prime minister with a memorable closing line: "India must pull itself up by its bootstraps to survive." Janki Ganju, a family friend and the Indian embassy's one-man lobbyist in Washington for some 30 years, who was with Indira Gandhi, was surprised that she listened to Reagan in silence. When the president finished, her reply was just one crushing sentence: "Mr President, in order for us to pull ourselves up by bootstraps, first we must have boots." End of meeting.

A quarter century later, the roles had been completely reversed. When Manmohan Singh went to Washington on a farewell visit for George W Bush, the president was a deeply troubled man. The global economic meltdown in 2008 had blemished Bush's legacy. It had already been tainted by his ill-conceived war against Iraq and a

disastrous attempt to recreate this cradle of civilisation in America's image. As was typical of him, Singh gave Bush a lesson in economics without being patronising. After the prime minister left the White House, their spokesperson said at an informal gaggle that Bush had told Singh he felt comforted and at peace after their conversation. Obama expressed similar feelings to Singh at their lunch in New Delhi in 2010.

would be a mistake to be judgemental about Modi's ongoing meetings with Donald Trump solely based on the popular caricatures of the new White House occupant. Taranjit Singh Sandhu, who was the ambassador in Washington during Trump's visit to India in 2020, is on record that the incumbent president absorbs his talking points and retains the essence of briefings by his aides. When Sandhu presented his credentials to Trump and again called on him to discuss his visit to India, the ambassador found the president intimately aware of Modi's home state of Gujarat, even about the world's biggest cricket stadium named after the prime minister. The crucial difference between then and now is that today, there are few people in the White House and the

state department who are capable or authorised to prepare Trump for dealing with India while Modi is in Washington. The senior director of the National Security Council (NSC) dealing with India and the assistant secretary of state for South and Central Asia normally brief the US president ahead of a visit like Modi's. The ambassador in New Delhi also reaches Washington in time for it. Trump has not nominated an ambassador to India after Eric Garcetti, a Democrat, left the post when Joe Biden failed to win a second term. Till the time of writing this, Trump has not appointed a new NSC director to deal with India. In the absence of a new

assistant secretary of state, career diplomat Eric Meyer is the 'senior bureau official' for South Asia. This is his second job at the moment—the first being as chargé d'affaires ad interim at the US embassy in Norway, which is his priority. Meyer was rushed to Washington on 'temporary duty' by new Secretary of State Marco



Rubio on January 20, probably because Rubio saw in Meyer's bio-data a stint many years ago as a senior adviser in the state department's South Asia bureau. Ahead of Modi's arrival in Washington, Meyer would have lacked institutional support within the state department. The critical post of deputy assistant secretary for India is vacant; so are the positions of several others who keep the bureau well-oiled and functioning.

In the commerce department, which provides significant inputs on trade tariffs, not a single senior employee has been confirmed by the Senate. Operationally, the most

important commerce post for India's interests would be the combined one of assistant secretary for global markets and director general of the US and Foreign Commercial Service; two successive appointees to the job in the recent past have been Indian Americans. Trump has not even found a nominee for assistant

> secretary for Indo-Pacific security in the department of defence.It is pertinent to ask if these mid-level officials have any relevance when External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has been dealing with National Security Adviser Michael Waltz since December and has met Rubio twice. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh spoke to his Pentagon counterpart a few days ago. Vitally, they are the ones who chart the India policy that trickles up the political ladder; they can put up roadblocks, too. The political leadership often does not have the time or inclination to challenge them. And, typically, they are not sheep.In the coming days and weeks, both sides

will window-dress the Modi-Trump meeting as the resurrection of their personal chemistry and the starting point of a great relationship for the next four years, concessions by New Delhi to incentivise Trump notwithstanding. Both sides will also repackage Biden's important bilateral initiatives to paint them in Trump's image. Setbacks, if any, will be given a softer face.

This is not to rule out better India-US relations; but the meat in the relationship will take time to cook. If only because, right now, Trump has bigger priorities than India, which cannot make America great or rich, as his favourite slogan demands from the rest of the world.

# BJP has no intention of fulfilling promises made to Delhiites: Atishi

NEW DELHI. Outgoing Chief Minister Atishi on Friday alleged that the BJP has no intention of fulfilling the promises made to the people of Delhi during the assembly elections. She accused the BJP of only wanting to loot by making the excuse of financial crisis.

She said that the AAP government has handed over a strong economy to the BJP in Delhi. "As the outgoing CM, today I want to present to the people of Delhi the economic growth that has taken place over the last 10 years so that during the BJP's tenure, they can't come up with excuses and must fulfill the promises made to the people," Atishi said.

"The AAP government was formed in 2015. At that time, Delhi's total budget was Rs 31,000 crore—whereas in 2009, the budget was Rs 25,000 crore, which in five years increased by Rs 6,000 crore to reach Rs 31,000 crore. After the AAP government came to power, the budget further rose from Rs 31,000 crore in 2014-15 to Rs 77,000 crore in 2024-25," Atishi added. In such a situation, it is now the



responsibility of the BJP government to fulfill its promises and especially to fulfill the promise of giving Rs 2500 rupees per month to women in the first cabinet meeting. So that by March 8, the first installment of Rs 2500 reaches the accounts of women as per their promise, the caretaker CM said. 

New Delhi. President Donald Trump said he'd given the go-ahead to extradite Tahawwur Rana, accused in the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, to India while hosting Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the White House on Thursday. Trump's decision follows a US Supreme Court ruling last month dismissing Rana's review petition, clearing the way for his extradition.

Addressing a joint press briefing with PM Modi, Trump said his administration had approved the extradition of one of the "very evil people" of the world.

'He is going to be going back to India to face justice," Trump said. "We're giving him back to India immediately," he added, noting that more such extraditions could follow as the US has "quite a few requests" from New Delhi

Indian Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri confirmed that the government is working on the logistics of Rana's surrender and extradition from the US. "This is an issue on which the US



authorities have taken very clear decisions." Misri said. "We are working on the logistics of his surrender and extradition to India. There are a few final steps to be completed. The two sides are in touch on this particular issue."

Government sources said all legal documents and warrants have been issued and shared with US authorities. Now that the US has given the green light, officials are finalising the date

and time of Rana's transfer. According to sources, the Ministry of External Affairs is coordinating with American counterparts, and a team from the National Investigation Agency (NIA) is expected to travel to the US once clearance is granted.

Indian officials are hopeful Rana will be brought back within weeks. Upon arrival, he will be produced before a special NIA court, where authorities plan to seek his custody for further questioning, sources said.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Modi praised Trump's decision to extradite Rana, likening the Mumbai attacks to "genocide" and pledging that "appropriate action" would be taken against him in Indian courts.

The joint India-US statement issued following PM Modi's meeting with Trump also reaffirmed both nations' commitment to combating terrorism and eliminating terrorist safe havens worldwide."India and the US will stand strongly together in the fight against terrorism," PM Modi said.

# BJP's 10 major challenges in Delhi after historic win

After a historic win in Delhi, BJP faces the challenge of fulfilling promises like cleaning the Yamuna, offering freebies, and improving infrastructure while balancing a tight budget.

New Delhi. After securing a historic victory in Delhi, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) now faces its biggest challenge - fulfilling its ambitious electoral promises while balancing the state's financial health.

The party campaigned on issues like cleaning the Yamuna, tackling garbage piles, improving roads, water supply, and sanitation, while highlighting the unfulfilled promises of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). In its manifesto, the BJP promised to fulfil Arvind Kejriwal's incomplete pledges and offered several freebies. Now, with Delhi's voters ending According to Delhi government data, the the BJP's 27-year-long wait, the party faces the daunting task of delivering on these promises.

BJP's key promises include providing Rs 2,500 a month to poor women, Rs 21,000 one-time aid to pregnant women, LPG cylinders for the poor at Rs 500, and Rs

2,500 pension for senior citizens (Rs 3,000 for those over 70), and free education from kindergarten to postgraduate levels for children from poor families.

However, fulfilling these promises will be challenging given the limited budget and Delhi's financial situation, although BJP holding power at the Centre may ease the burden for BJP government in Delhi.

DELHI'S FINANCIAL SITUATION

projected tax revenue for the state in 2024-25 is Rs 58,750 crore, while the total budget is Rs 76,000 crore. The education budget is Rs 16,396 crore, accounting for 22% of the total. Other significant expenditures include housing, urban development, healthcare,



transportation, and welfare programs. However, two-thirds of the budget is already allocated for salaries, pensions, and administrative costs, raising concerns about a potential deficit. By the end of this financial year, the expected revenue from taxes and other sources is estimated to drop from Rs 64,142 crore to Rs 62,415 crore. Looking at the BJP's electoral

promises, the scheme to provide Rs 2,500 financial aid per month to women is expected to cost around Rs 11,000 crore annually. Delhi has an estimated 24.4 lakh senior citizens, so, offering Rs 2,500 monthly (Rs 3,000 for those over 70) would require an additional Rs 4,100 crore per year.

YAMUNA: A COSTLY CHALLENGE

The cost of cleaning the Yamuna alone has exceeded Rs 8,000 crore in recent years, but the river remains in a deplorable state in Delhi. Upgrading Delhi's government hospitals would require an estimated Rs 10,200 crore. Additionally, completing the third phase of the Delhi Metro expansion and developing the fourth phase will cost Rs 2.700 crore.

### Two more US flights with illegal migrants to land in Punjab on February 15-16



New Delhi. Two more special flights from the United States carrying illegal Indian immigrants will land in Punjab's Amritsar over the weekend, according to a written communication sent by the Ministry of External Affairs to the Bureau of Civil Aviation. The development comes on a day Prime Minister Narendra Modi raised the issue with US President Donald Trump and underscored that India was fully prepared to take back "verified" citizens living in America illegally.

#### Jamia students detained amid protest over action on PhD scholars for anti-CAA stir anniversary event

NEW DELHI. Several students from Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) were detained by Delhi Police on Thursday during a sit-in demonstration against the university's disciplinary action against two PhD

The protests, which began on Monday, was in response to the administration's action against two scholars accused of organising a demonstration last year to mark the anniversary of the 2019 anti-CAA protests. Students alleged that the disciplinary actions were unjust, prompting them to occupy the academic block

In an official statement, JMI confirmed that the protesting students were removed from the campus with police assistance. The university accused them of disrupting academic activities, damaging property, and obstructing access to the Central Library and classrooms, especially with mid-semester exams approaching.

"A handful of students called for an unlawfully gathering in the academic block since the evening of February 10, 2025. They have not only disturbed peaceful conduct of classes in the academic block of the university but also prevented students from accessing the Central Library and attending classes at a time when mid semester exams are about to begin," JMI stated.

The administration further alleged that the demonstrators vandalised campus property, including the central canteen, and forcibly broke the gate of the security advisor's office. It claimed that students violated university regulations and were found carrying "objectionable contraband items." Meanwhile. protesting students claimed their families were being contacted by the police after the university filed a complaint.

#### Son, accomplice househelp held for father's murder over property dispute

NEW DELHI. A long-standing family dispute over property led to the murder of a 67-year-old man, allegedly planned by his son with the help of the family's servant, an official said on Thursday, adding that, the body was found in a gunny bag and in a decomposed state, officials said.

According to cops, Bharadwaj's son, Love Bharadwaj, was reportedly distressed over the possibility of being evicted from the family home due to his love marriage after his father sought legal intervention.

Fearful of losing his residence, Love conspired to kill his father. "Bharadwaj had left for Narela on his scooter on January 28 but never returned. During the investigation, it was found that he was last seen with his long-time servant, Jitender. A team interrogated multiple people and discovered that Bharadwaj had been visiting a rented flat where Jitender lived. Jitender and his son Vishal were found missing, and Vishal's phone was switched off," DCP (Outer North) Nidhin

Police traced a number linked to Vishal, which was active on social media. Using technical surveillance, Vishal was nabbed, and during questioning, he confessed to the crime. He revealed he, along with his father Jitender, had murdered Bharadwaj on January 28.

Using complex genetic data analysis and testing, scientists have shown for the first time that allantoin, which is found in botanical extracts of the comfrey plant and is an ingredient of many antiageing creams, can mimic the effect of calorie restriction and increase lifespan in worms by more

than 20 percent.

Calorie restriction -- a reduction in calorie intake without malnutrition, has been found to slow down the ageing process in several animal models from worms to mammals, and developing drugs that can reproduce this effect, without the side effects, could have widespread

human applications. "Calorie restriction has been shown to have health benefits in humans and, while more work is necessary, our findings could potentially result in human therapies for agerelated diseases," said study lead author Joao Pedro de Magalhaes from University of Liverpool in Britain.

To identify potential calorie restriction mimetic compounds, the team made use of existing molecular signatures from human cells and

'Testing anti-aging interventions in humans is not practical, so developing computational methods to predict longevity drugs is of great use," Shaun Calvert from University of Liverpool

Four IPL franchises won bids to buy stakes in 4 Hundred teams. Mumbai Indians, Lucknow



SuperGiants, SunRisers Hyderabad, and Delhi Capitals placed the winning bids and bought Oval Invincibles, London Spirit, Northern Superchargers, and Southern Brave, respectively. With IPL teams buying four franchises in the tournament, it continued the trend of IPL expanding its reach across the world. IPL teams have stakes in the CPL, SA20, and even the MLC.

According to an ESPNcricinfo report, the exposure of Pakistan players to IPL-owned teams has been limited over the last few years. Asked about this ahead of the 5th edition of the tournament, ECB chief executive Gould stressed that, in the Hundred, the involvement of top Pakistan players will not decrease in the next few years. We're aware of that in other regions,"

Gould told ESPNcricinfo about Pakistan players' limited exposure in IPL-owned teams in other tournaments; "but that won't be happening here," he added. The ECB chief executive also said that while the league would like to have Indian players in the competition, they understood the BCCI's firm stand on not allowing contracted cricketers to play outside the country. Recently, players like Dinesh Karthik and Unmukt Chand have played in franchise leagues outside of India, but that came after they quit Indian cricket."In terms of availability of Indian players, that is not factored into our plans. The BCCI's position has been very clear. At some point, we'd love to see Indian players come and play in England. We currently see them, obviously, in bilaterals and actually quite a lot in

county cricket. But that's not something that we have predetermined through this process," Gould said.

The Hundred's 5th season is set to start on August 5, with the final scheduled to be played on 31st of the same month. The tournament will start on the very next day after the conclusion of India's 5-match Test tour of England
